The Access 303 Sport Single Seat Sailing Dinghy



Summary of Main Features:

- *Delivered with two jibs, one self tacking and one larger manual jib for extra power.
- *Steered by manual joystick, fully roller reef-able mainsail that is controlled by a manual mainsheet.
- *Has the option of electric servo-assisted drives to the mainsheet and tiller, making it suitable for people with severely reduced mobility.
- *High boom is kept well away from helms head, wide side decking keeps the sailor dry when heeled to extremes and there is no need hiking out.
- *Fully roller reef-able mainsail and jib which allows it to be set up to sail in a broad range of wind conditions and by people with a wide range of sailing abilities.
- *With the seat keeping the helms weight low plus weighted centre board type keel, the boat is virtually uncapsizable.
- *Available in many different colours of deck and sail for easily distinguishable fleet sailing, which is very useful for safety monitoring and video/photo feedback.

People who has limited or no use of their limbs and few opportunities to do physical activities alone, to be able sail on their own and have as equal a chance of racing success as everyone else, is incredibly empowering and liberating.

A single seat, twin rudder version of the popular Access 303W. Designed for single handed sailing by sailors with very limited mobility and for the more experienced sailor who is looking for the extra challenge of performance solo sailing. It has a larger manual jib for extra power as well as the self tacking jib for use with electrics and early training.

The single seat cockpit is, because of the wide side decks, narrower than the Access 303 two person model and gives much more side support to those sailors who need this.

The boat can also be fitted with electric controls for sailors with very limited mobility.

The wide and high side decks allow the boat to be fully heeled without shipping water and the twin rudders maintain full tiller control at even the most acute heeling angles.

This is the model of choice for any sailability group that plans to provide sailing opportunities to either people who need the extra protection from the water and/or the extra support of the narrow single seat cockpit and/or the challenge of single handed two sail sailing, which is a massive confidence builder. In an ideal club arrangement the sailor would move into this model for their solo sailing and racing after first learning the basics of sailing accompanied in 303 two person boat.

Sail Plan Mainsail and free standing self tacking jib

Sail area Main 5.0 sq m, Jib 0.8 sq m, total 5.8 sq m.
(Unbattened and reefable to 0.5 sq. mtr)

Mast Main unstayed 4.85mtr, Jib unstayed 2.85
(Both incorporating reefing drum in foot)

Hull Positive buoyancy and rockered for easy manoeuvrability.

Strong construction with solid bonded hull/deck joins.

Seating Single hammock seat or special hard seat.

Controls Steered by manual joystick., Reefed / unreefed by hauling lines. Sails controlled by a manual mainsheets.

Note: The Access 303 has the option of a **stowage box** for a ventilator. This is an extra and must be specified on ordering and fitted at manufacture.
